

Judge 1914-1920

Kenneth Roberts' Verse, Prose, and Essays in *Judge* (1881-1947)

- Kenneth Roberts' name appeared in different forms. Each article listed below includes how his name appears with the published piece. Note: "Lawrence Kane" was Roberts' pseudonym under which he published while deployed in WWI (1918-1919).
- P. Murphy privately published a bibliography of Roberts' work in 1975 (n. p.). Unlike other bibliographies, Murphy includes Roberts' earliest works in *Life*, *Puck*, and *Judge*. I have checked my bibliography against his, and where necessary, made corrections. However, I also note where Murphy's bibliography is in error or where there is a discrepancy between my research and Murphy's bibliography.
- There are no page numbers given in the scans I've viewed. However, Murphy notes page numbers for entries from *Judge*. Because I cannot verify the accuracy of these page numbers, I have marked them with an asterisk. If there is no page number, then Murphy did not include the entry in his bibliography and the page number was not given in the scans found on the Internet Archive.
